List of environmental factors considered	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Inclusion in the index universe is based on reliable and credible sustainable track records and/or business plans that contribute to a more sustainable world. An evaluation takes place within the sector. The company's level of exposure to significant sectoral issues and sector-based risks and opportunities is taken into account. The evaluation is based on the recognition of and actions in accordance with companies' social responsibility by the formulation of clear and ambitious policies, the allocation of effective resources, and the demonstration of measurable results. Companies involved in significant issues or controversies are evaluated individually and potentially excluded. Based on the factors, Forum Ethibel, an independent third party performing this task under contract with the Data provider, determines the selection of the index universe > The companies in the Index Universe are evaluated in the field of Corporate Social Responsibility based on a 6-level rating scale provided by the Data Provider: A: Pioneers (outstanding and/or innovative in terms of Corporate Social Responsibility; only the very best companies are included here. For many industries, this rating is non-existent) ; B: Best-in-class companies; C: Companies that perform above average; D: Followers, companies performing below average ; E: Laggards and/or non-transparent companies ; M: Involvement in activities related to armament, gambling, nuclear energy and tobacco which automatically lead to exclusion All companies rated "A", "B" or "C" are eligible for inclusion > Exclusion of companies with major involvement in one of the following areas: nuclear energy, fossil fuels
